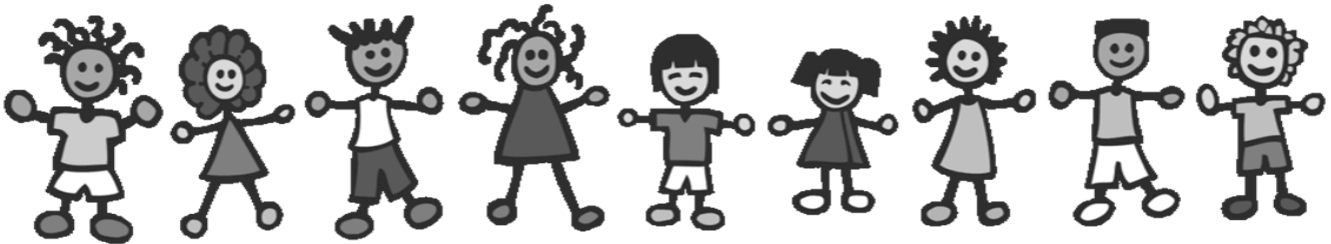

Olmsted County Licensing News



DATA PRIVACY ISSUES – SOCIAL MEDIA

The Department of Human Services frequently receives questions concerning posting client information on social networking and program websites.

The Department states that while the general use of these sites is not prohibited, disclosing records or pictures of children and adults served in licensed programs without permission is prohibited. This includes posting information about a child, adult, or the individual's family on a personal blog, website, Facebook page, or any other social media site. The following rule addresses this issue:

MN Rule 9502.0345, subp. 2, requires that the provider shall not disclose any records on children in care to any persons other than the parents of the child, the agency, the department, and medical or public safety persons if information is necessary to protect the health and safety of the child. **Providers may also disclose information necessary to comply with reporting requirements for suspected abuse and neglect.**

Remember, you can access the Olmsted County website for child care forms, updates, provider information, monthly orientation schedule, and more.

Minnesota has moved towards an online system for tracking training and professional development. Now that this transition has taken place, many training sponsors will no longer offer training certificates. FCCI is an approved Develop/MNCPD training sponsor and, while we will continue to offer paper certificates for the time being, we are also recording attendance in the Develop/MNCPD registry.

All providers must sign in at the membership desk and verify your Develop/MNCPD number. This will facilitate entry of your attendance at our workshop. Without your MNCPD number FCCI is not able to enter your attendance and you will be responsible to send in a copy of your training certificate to the registry for licensure review.
