

PAINTING







Playdough Ice Cream—It Looks Real!

What you need:

- Ready-made frosting. I used a Betty Crocker 435g tub of vanilla frosting
- Approximately 4 cups icing sugar
- Food coloring
- Ice cream cones (or small bowls/cupcake cases), sprinkles, scoops and anything else you need for play

In a large bowl, add half of the frosting (which is approx. ¾ cup). Leave the other half for another batch. The 435g frosting tub I used made 2 batches of dough so I made one pink and the other green.

Using the dough hooks on your mixer, gradually add in 2 cups of icing sugar. Mix until the dough comes together is not sticky. I actually used slightly less than 2 cups so keep feeling it until it is no longer sticky.

Add in a few drops of coloring and mix until combined. Transfer to a bowl and set aside.

Repeat process with remaining frosting and icing sugar. This time, add a different color. Transfer into a bowl and you are ready for play.

Set up a scene using your different flavored 'ice cream' along with cones, sprinkles, scoops, bowls, muffin cups, spoons and whatever you associate with eating ice cream. Let their little imaginations run wild as they order, create and serve.

Contractors vs. Employees - Definitions & Requirements

<u>A contractor</u> is self-employed and in the business of providing substitute care for child care providers. This person must work for more than one provider, have a business name, register their name with the state, and use their own contract.

Contractors must have a cleared NETStudy2.0 Background Study prior to providing substitute services and complete required initial training before substituting and annual training thereafter.

An Employee is any person who performs services for another for hire.

If you pay a person to help you care for children, this person is your employee and you must purchase workers' compensation insurance to cover them unless that person is your spouse, your parent or your own children. The Minnesota Department of Labor and Industry Construction Codes and Licensing Division requires that employees in a family child care business be covered by Worker's Compensation Insurance. This is true regardless of how little you pay the person or how few hours they work for you.


If someone helps you care for children as a volunteer and you don't pay the person, you don't have an employee. If you buy clothing or other items for the volunteer in exchange for her or his work, this would be considered compensation and the person would then be considered an employee.

<u>Examples</u>: You hire a substitute to care for the children while you go to the dentist for 3 hours; a hired high school student to help you care for children for eight weeks in the summer; you hire someone to help you care for children full-time. All these situations mean you have an "employee".

Unfortunately, many providers make the mistake of thinking they aren't required to get workers' compensation insurance because they only use part-time helpers. Not true! The Minnesota Workers' Compensation Law has been around for many years.

Workers' compensation insurance provides benefits to employees who are injured while working. If your worker gets injured while working for you, and you don't have this insurance, you will be forced to pay the worker's entire medical bill, plus a large fine. This can be a significant expense to you!

In addition, there are payroll taxes that you must pay when you hire an employee. These include: Social Security/Medicare tax as well as federal and state unemployment taxes. These payroll tax rules and the federal and state tax forms you must fill out are complicated. You may want to consult a tax professional for help.

PACK 'n PLAYS (Mesh-sided cribs)

If you have a pack 'n play and the floor mat is buckling or has broken loose and the sections are sliding underneath each other, it is no longer in good condition and it needs to be removed from service. If you choose to replace the floor mat, it must be with one that is purchased from the company that manufactured the pack 'n play and must be for that brand and model number. Not just **ANY** mattress can be placed in the pack 'n play. Remember, there are height and weight restrictions on all pack 'n plays. If you find any holes or tears in the unit, the unit is no longer safe and needs to be permanently taken out of service. All cribs need to be checked monthly with an on-site inspection. The cribs also need to be checked for recalls annually on the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission website (www.cpsc.gov).

Got a "beaver" chewing on your crib?: Information you need to know about CRIBS from MN Statute 245A and Rule 9502

If a wood crib is missing parts of wood and/or varnish/stain due to chewing or by other means, a **correction order** will be issued. The correction order may cite MN Statute 245A.146 Subd 4 Wood surfaces are smooth and solid and are free from splinters, splits, and cracks OR MN Rule 9502.0415 Subp 3 Equipment is safe and in good repair.

Providers cannot alter the crib in any way by sanding, staining, painting, etc. The crib must be removed from use. Manufacturers will not stand behind the safety of the crib if you alter it in **ANY WAY.**

When shopping for new sleep equipment, you may want to check out mini-cribs as many providers are "talking these up" as great replacement sleep units.

NETStudy 2.0 Enhanced Fingerprinting Background Studies

We have had a lot of calls about the NETStudy 2.0 studies and when will they resume. The answer we can share is "we do not know yet" – so stay tuned. We will be providing you with the information you will need to get your NETStudy background study completed when the process resumes.
